According to Paul Carney from MEGT, Ms Ketchell has a flair for administration and computers. **'The maturity and forward thinking Palissa shows in setting her career goals and working on her plan to achieve them shows just how much potential she has to do well. The commencement of a career with a traineeship means she will have a head start in a job and will be earning an income at the same time she is training for her qualification.'**

What am I?


