## Are you IT literate?

Do you know about hyphens and dashes?

A hyphen is used in a compound word, for example, *up-to-date* or *well-kept* without spaces **around the hyphen or to represent the word 'to' in figures, for example 53-55**, again with no spaces around it.

A dash is used to indicate a pause in a sentence. It can be typed two ways: with a space on either side, for example, *I am going – but not till tomorrow* or with two hyphens and no spaces, for example, *I want to go—but I can't afford it.*
