## Choices 2014

On Wednesday the 15th October our year 12 cohort at Tully SHS were privileged to watch the "Choices 2014" performance which is currently touring the far north region. So what is "Choices" about anyway?

"Choices" is an applied theatre project which promotes key safety messages around alcohol, drugs and sexual activity for young people, by young people, using a music theatre format of comic skits, song and dance. It is an initiative of Queensland Police Service and CQ University, Conservatorium of music in partnership with the Whitsunday Regional Council. While the contents of the performance was at times very funny, it also had some powerful messages about safety that resonated with our year 12 students.

The program grew out of a need for equipping and educating year 12 students in North Queensland as a strategy for minimising harm, as they graduate school and celebrate Schoolies in the Whitsunday region. The Whitsunday Schoolies event, based at Airlie Beach Queensland, regularly attracts thousands of year 12 students who can safely enjoy the extensive range of activities organised by the Whitsunday Regional Council with the help of tourist operators. The morning was also attended by three of our local police officers, who came to lend their support to the program and answer any questions that the students had.
