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Art in the Classroom

Visual Arts students in year 10 have taken the traditional still life and given it a contemporary twist. Firstly students arranged objects and photographed their still life composition. These photographs were printed on a large scale in full colour, then students ripped off sections and redrew the missing pieces. They chose from a variety of media including watercolour, charcoal, pencil or soft pastels. The artwork featured is by talented student Nathan Long. He chose to use a pencil rendering technique and the results are stunning. This realistic drawing style is becoming Nathan's signature aesthetic, in fact all students are encouraged to find their own individual style based on their strengths and character.
