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| Wellbeing Program | Compulsory for Year 9 Students - Tuesdays Period 1 <i>Students engage in a range of learning experiences that develop their personal and social capabilities, emotional intelligence, 21st Century Skills and awareness of the requirements for different pathways.</i> | Free |
| Resilience Project | Compulsory for Year 9 Students - Tuesdays Period 1 <i>The Resilience Project aims to build a resilient school community. It centres around the evidence-based principles of Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness (GEM) and Emotional Literacy. The program equips students with lifelong wellbeing habits and empowers families to support wellbeing at home.</i> | Student Booklet included in SRS funding |
| Duke of Edinburgh Award | Opt-in opportunity – Completed in Wellbeing time and outside of school time to complete the requirements of the Award. <i>This is an amazing opportunity for students to challenge themselves, build leadership qualities, step outside their comfort zone and grow as young adults! Students will enrol in the Bronze Award as part of the Duke of Edinburgh Award. Students will be required to complete 13hrs of voluntary service, 13 hrs of a skill, and 13 hours of physical recreation over a period of 3-4 months. | JET Plan Interviews | Vital for all Year 9 Students and Parents - Appointments available from Term 1 Week 8 until Term 2 week 5 <i>JET Plan interviews will focus on students' academic achievement, effort, behaviour, and attendance.
